



George Himes Project Summary

As part of a long-term project to restore the entire Marquam-Terwilliger corridor led by the West Willamette Restoration Partnership, the focus is now on areas in and around George Himes Park. This restoration project is focused on improving the health of our forests and watersheds in this corridor by removing invasive plants and installing native plants.

Portland Parks & Recreation and Friends of Terwilliger will conduct restoration efforts within the park with trained and volunteer crews. West Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District and Backyard Habitat Certification Program will work with private landowners and residents to restore land surrounding the park.

Participants will use “best management practices” to improve these natural areas. Private landowners and residents around the park will receive technical assistance and gain access to competitive financial assistance to complete the work.
